## PDC- “PRACTICAL LOCAL EXHAUST VENTILATION MAINTENANCE”

---

### Fall PDC ON SEPTEMBER 24 AND 25

This fall’s PDC offers us another opportunity to refresh our knowledge of one of our profession’s basic building blocks- local exhaust ventilation. The PDC will focus on the “care and feeding” of local exhaust ventilation systems and their components. The PDC will show practical examples of the reasons behind system design and the simple maintenance tools one can use to keep them working as designed for years after startup. We will also have practice with commonly used system troubleshooting methodologies.

The course will be taught by Gary Q. Johnson, PE. Gary has 27 years of safety, health, and environmental engineering experience in the manufacturing sector at Procter and Gamble plus 5 years of military experience on nuclear submarines. He has a Bachelor of Chemical Engineering from Ohio State University and a MBA from the University of Scranton. He is currently a member of The Health and Safety Alliance, Inc. in Cincinnati, Ohio. He is a faculty member for the NC State Industrial Ventilation Conference and for the UNC Education and Research Center-Occupational Safety and Health Institutes. He has been a member of the ACGIH Ventilation Committee since 1999. The Ventilation Committee publishes the widely used handbook, “Industrial Ventilation,” and is working on a related manual, “Industrial Ventilation: A User’s Manual” that is focused on system operation and maintenance.
